#### **DEFINITION AND PURPOSE:**

The Eagle Ridge United Church Benevolent Fund is used to support members and adherents of the congregation, as well as individuals from the broader community, in times of need.

### CANADA REVENUE AGENCY REQUIREMENTS

- Money is raised by accepting specific contributions to the Benevolent Fund. These
  contributions qualify as a charitable donation, and will be receipted by the Envelope
  Secretary at the end of each year.
- 2. Funds must be made available to the wider community and not just Eagle Ridge United Church members.
- 3. All contributions are made to the Benevolent Fund, never to assist identified individuals or families.

#### **EAGLE RIDGE POLICY:**

- 1. The Ministry Staff are solely responsible for disbursing funds in a confidential and timely manner.
- 2. These funds are meant primarily for the necessities of life in times of crisis and immediate financial distress.
- 3. For those not known to Eagle Ridge United Church, verification of the person's identity is required in the form of photo identification. First-time grants have a maximum of \$50.00 until further assessment of need is made. Further assessment includes verification of need and the facts presented.
- 4. Maximum amount to be given at any one time is \$300.00. Any amount above that must be approved by Session. Email is an acceptable method of attaining approval.
- 5. If a person makes a THIRD request for funds, Session must approve the granting of funds.
- 6. If the minister is ever uncertain about granting funds to any individual, for any reason, Session must be consulted and asked to approve the request.
- 7. Whenever reasonable, the Ministers or Office Administrator should direct people in need to an appropriate agency.
- 8. Assistance should be of a short term nature and not ongoing assistance.
- 9. The Ministers will maintain accurate confidential records, including names of recipients and amounts given.
- 10. Staff are NEVER permitted to loan personal money to anyone asking for assistance.
